



## **Renasant Roots Triples Its Support of Black-owned Businesses**

**BIRMINGHAM, AL** – Renasant Roots kicked off its 2022 cohort during Black Business Month with a record number of participants and an inspirational presentation on Overcoming Obstacles led by guest speakers that included Ed Fields, Senior Advisor & Chief Strategist at City of Birmingham Office of Mayor Randall L. Woodfin, award-winning journalist / founder of See Jane Write, Javacia Harris Bowser, and John Bentley, Regional President-Central Community at Renasant.

Renasant Bank, in partnership with Birmingham Business Resource Center, leads the capacity building program by engaging and empowering entrepreneurs in a six-week technical assistance and mentoring program facilitated by banking and industry experts with sessions covering Financial Management, Marketing & Branding, Contracts & Certifications, and The Power of Diversity. Program participants also receive a capacity-building grant upon completion of the program.

COVID-19 created critical challenges across all business sectors, but the pandemic presented even greater threats to the types of businesses served by the Renasant Roots Entrepreneurial Success Series. Renasant Roots stepped up to better serve disadvantaged, minority-owned, and women-owned businesses in need by doubling its cohort size with the capacity building program in 2020 and extending its service area from Birmingham, Alabama to Florida, Tennessee, and Mississippi, where Renasant was founded and is headquartered today. This year, the capacity building program took its program a step further by tripling its cohort size after receiving a record number of applications.
